

Celebrant Dear friends, we are gathered here this morning on the traditional unceded territory of the Algonquin Nation.

Gloria:

Celebrant Glory to God in the highest,

All **and peace to his people on earth.**

Lord God, heavenly king, almighty God and Father, we worship you, we give you thanks, we praise you for your glory. Lord Jesus Christ, only Son of the Father, Lord God, Lamb of God, you take away the sin of the world: have mercy on us; you are seated at the right hand of the Father: receive our prayer.

For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father. Amen.

Collect:

Creator of the fruitful earth, you made us stewards of all things. Homily

The Apostles' Creed

Celebrant Let us confess the faith of our baptism, as we say,

All I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth. I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the

Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

Intercessions:

On this Thanksgiving Sunday we remember the gift of creation which our God has given to us. We give thanks and ask that we may be always good stewards of these resources. We remember in particular all who work on the land and seas providing us with food and resources

In peace we pray to you Lord God

Leader: We pray for all people in their daily life and work. We remember especially those who are working on the frontlines: careworkers, medical staff, first responders, and service providers

All: For our family, friends and neighbours and for all who are alone

Leader: For this community, our country and the world

All: For all who work for justice and peace

Leader: For the just and proper use of your creation;

All: For the victims of hunger, fear and injustice and oppression

Leader: For all who are in danger, sorrow or any kind of trouble

All: For those who minister to the sick, the friendless and the needy

Leader: For the peace and unity of the Church of God

All: For all who proclaim the gospel and all who seek the truth

Leader: For Shane our bishop, and for all bishops: Anne our metropolitan, Linda and Mark our national archbishops and all other ministers, upholding the clergy of this Diocese especially

All: For all who serve God in the church

Leader: For our own needs and those of others. Let us uphold those who are gathered with us in spirit. This morning we remember especially all those for whom our prayers are asked including Nigel, Graham, Diane, Ren, Sarah and all others who are on our hearts, in silence or aloud.

Hear us Lord

All For your mercy is great

Leader: As we mark this Harvest Thanksgiving we recall and give thanks for your many gifts to us Gracious Lord. May we remember always that we move through this life accompanied by your gracious love. We will exalt you O God our divine ruler

All: And praise your name for ever and ever

Leader: We pray for those who have died in the peace of Christ and for those whose faith is known to you alone, that they may have a place in your eternal kingdom. Lord let your loving kindness be upon them.

All: Who put their trust in you

Leader: Gracious God you have heard the prayers of your faithful people; you know our needs before we ask, and our ignorance in asking. Grant our requests as may be best for us. This we ask in the name of your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen**

Celebrant: The Peace of the Lord be always with you

All: And also with you

THE CELEBRATION OF THE EUCHARIST

Prayer over the Gifts:

Source of all life, the heaven and earth are yours, yet, you have given us dominion over all things. Receive the symbols of our labour and love which we offer you this day, in the name of Jesus Christ our Lord.

The Great Thanksgiving:

Celebrant The Lord be with you

People And also with you.

Celebrant Lift up your hearts.

People We lift them to the Lord.

Celebrant Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

People It is right to give our thanks and praise.

Celebrant It is right to give you thanks and praise, O Lord our God, sustainer of the universe, you are worthy of glory and praise

People Glory to you for ever and ever.

Celebrant At your command all things came to be: the vast expanse of interstellar space, galaxies, suns, the planets in their courses, and this fragile earth, our island home; by your will they were created and have their being.

People Glory to you for ever and ever.

Celebrant From the primal elements you brought forth the human race, and blessed us with memory, reason, and skill; you made us the stewards of creation.

People Glory to you for ever and ever.

Celebrant But we turn against you, and betray your trust; and we turn against one another. Again and again you call us to return. Through the prophets and sages you reveal your righteous law. In the fullness of time you sent your Son, born of a woman, to be our Saviour. He was wounded for our transgressions, and bruised for our iniquities. By his death he opened to us the way of freedom and peace.

People **Glory to you for ever and ever.**

Therefore we praise you, joining with the heavenly chorus, with prophets, apostles, and martyrs, and with those in every generation who have looked to you in hope, to proclaim with them your glory, in their unending hymn:

**Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might,
heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest.**

Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

Blessed are you, Lord our God, for sending us Jesus, the Christ, who on the night he was handed over to suffering and death, took bread, said the blessing, broke the bread, gave it to his friends, and said, "Take this, and eat it: this is my body which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me." In the same way, after supper, he took the cup of wine; he gave you thanks, and said, "Drink this, all of you: this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Glory to you for ever and ever.

Gracious God, we recall the death of your Son Jesus Christ, we proclaim his resurrection and ascension, and we look with expectation for his coming as Lord of all the nations. We who have been redeemed by him, and made a new people by water and the Spirit, now bring you these gifts. Send your Holy

Spirit upon us and upon this offering of your Church, that we who eat and drink at this holy table may share the divine life of Christ our Lord.

Glory to you for ever and ever.

Pour out your Spirit upon the whole earth and make it your new creation. Gather your Church together from the ends of the earth into your kingdom, where peace and justice are revealed, that we, with all your people, of every language, race, and nation, may share the banquet you have promised; through Christ, with Christ, and in Christ, all honour and glory are yours, creator of all.

Glory to you for ever and ever. Amen.

Celebrant Gathering all our prayers into one, we are bold to pray

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.

Celebrant: Creator of all, you gave us golden fields of wheat, whose many grains we have gathered and made into this one bread.

All: So may your Church be gathered from the ends of the earth into your kingdom.

Celebrant. The Gifts of God given for us, the People of God

All: Thanks be to God

Communion Hymn: My life Flows On in Endless Song (401)
